Kim Storey, EdD, is a child development specialist, educator, and researcher who creates educational media. She has developed, designed, written, produced, and evaluated many highly acclaimed educational resources for kids, parents, and educators. These resources include television programs, videos, websites, toolkits, guidebooks, and educational initiatives. She is a consultant to educators, media companies, and professional organizations. She frequently serves as a featured speaker and conducts workshops throughout the US and internationally.

Dr. Storey applies child development principles, educational objectives, content expertise, and research-based strategies to ensure that projects and programs are educationally sound and developmentally appropriate for their target audiences. Her child development expertise includes early childhood through adolescence. Her content expertise includes bullying prevention, science education, media effects on kids, and children's social, emotional, and cognitive development.

As a bullying prevention educator, Dr. Storey helped to develop [BOSTON vs BULLIES](#), The Sports Museum's bullying prevention initiative, which includes educational videos, facilitator's guides, a website, onsite programs, online and remote learning, and teacher trainings. Dr. Storey has also created [Eyes on Bullying](#), [Eyes on Bullying in Early Childhood](#), [Eyes on Bullying: What You Can Do to Prevent and Stop Bullying at Camp](#) and [Bullying Prevention: A Guide for Grandparents](#).

As a Senior Scientist at Education Development Center (EDC), Dr. Storey contributed to strategic planning, writing, research, and website development for bullying prevention. She led a partnership between EDC and the Boston Public Schools to enhance bullying prevention education, with a focus on serving students with disabilities. The initiative included workshops, [guides](#), online professional development, and the *Saturdays for Success* bullying intervention student program.

Dr. Storey served as Interim Project Director for The Newton Partnership (federally-funded by the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative), where she managed a community-wide project to foster safe, respectful, and bullying-free school environments.

Other multimedia educational resources created by Dr. Storey include: (1) Parent and teacher websites and materials for the national PBS preschool science series [The Cat in the Hat Knows a Lot About That!](#) and (2) Educational objectives, content, and production concepts for Baby Abuelita Productions, a bilingual video series for preschoolers promoting Hispanic culture, language development in English and Spanish, and positive social-emotional growth.

While serving for nearly ten years as the Director of Educational Research at the WGBH Educational Foundation, Dr. Storey developed and managed educational television, video, technology, and print projects. She was Project Director for *Discovering Psychology*, a 26-part television course on introductory psychology, and Project Director for a five-year Harvard Educational Technology Center initiative researching the impact of new technologies for teaching science in schools. Dr. Storey has also served as a research consultant to Children's Television Workshop for *Sesame Street*, *The Electric Company*, and *3-2-1 Contact*.
